1. Opening Remarks

David Hamer (DH) welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked them to sign the record of attendance.

2. Apologies

3. Confirmation of minutes of previous meeting (2 November 2013)

The Minutes of the previous meeting had been circulated these were signed by DH as a true and correct record – proposed by Jess Townson (JT) and seconded by Faith Cosgrove (FC).

4. Matters arising from those minutes

4.1. Production of Notelets

4.1.1. The CSG discussed both individual photos and a collage to be printed onto the cards. James Sage (JS) commented that it had been a struggle to sell cards previously. The committee agreed to use all of the photos in an academic E-calendar that members could download for free from the NFYFC website. This was proposed by Mark Curr (MC) seconded by JS. All members of the committee were asked to download and promote E-calendar when it becomes available.

4.2. Parental Consent Forms

4.2.1. The committee agreed to increase the deadline for forms to be returned to the NFYFC office to 10 days from 5 days prior to the event to give time to check them before competitions.

4.3. Tenbury Show Crafts

4.3.1. The Cube Exhibit would be staged at Tenbury Show with the Top 3 sewing and journey of tweed boards to be displayed.(The Sewing and Boards would be judged at Competitions Day).

4.4. Senior Stockman Project

4.4.1. Kate & Dez Carless had reworded the project for 2014. Feedback regarding the project stated that the project is too intensive if you have not been to college and each time you enter you have to choose different stock. The CSG discussed making the project more realistic for 2015 and suggested asking the AGRI committee to input and design 3 project scenarios. Faith Cosgrove commented that all competitors should do a questionnaire on all 4 areas of stock and everybody should have the same project scenario. MC suggested a scenario of applying for a job. The CSG agreed to keep the practical vet section and also to include zero points on the mark sheet for not adhering to the word limit.

4.5. Sponsorship update from Christina Evans (CE) – NFYFC Fundraising Officer

4.5.1. Winston Churchill Memorial Trust funding 4 to 8 weeks travel for 18-25 year olds to include winning a VIP trip to Beauvais to the Vision of the Future 2014 on 26th – 28th August. Information available via NFYFC website. Deadline for applications is 31st July 2014.

4.5.2. RDP has funding for Leaders to be a local contact, which CE will support each county to encourage agricultural

applicants as currently this is dominated by the forestry sector.

4.5.3. Defra funding able to support stockman competitions but not ATV

4.5.4. Reasons for difficulty securing sponsorship for competitions due to:

- The closed nature of the venues
- Sponsors already having a presence at the big shows such as Dairy Stockjudging at the Great Yorkshire Show,
- National finals usually during the show season such as Competitions Day.
- Cost

4.5.5. Current sponsorship proposals in progress with CE include:

- Artisan Food for cookery requiring to have input with rules and presence at Malvern Show 2014/15
- David Austin Roses and seed companies for floral art.

4.5.6. Ways to potentially secure more sponsorship for competitions:

- Add value Eg: use marketing and positive PR, local community involvement, permanent display to promote YFC
- Take competitions to professional events such as Debating to the Oxford Farming Conference. Georgina Monk (GM) suggested asking sponsors to set topics. CSG explained to CE that topics only set 21 days prior to final and rules can be changed/adapted in September at the latest to accommodate sponsor requests. Debating Finals could also be at the centre of the AGRI forum.
- Move more comps to the AGM. All CSG members to take back to areas.
- Increase value for money which is currently being done via the Youth Forum at the CLA game fair and SMOTY Winner being an ambassador at the Livestock Show.

4.5.7. DH thanked CE for all of her hard work and support

4.6. English Speaking Union

6. Competition since the last meeting

6.1. **English Speaking Regional Finals**

Overall the Regional Speaking was poorly attended by spectators. However the CSG agreed to keep the Regional semi-finals as this is less travelling for teams and there is an additional WMA team next year bring the total to 11 teams at National Finals and 5 teams at the Southern Area Final.

6.1.1. Public Speaking Under 16

6.1.1.1. Correspondence received from Leicestershire suggesting that all teams should receive a prize card. The CSG discussed that with the cards costing £2 each it would remain that the top 3 placed teams would receive a place card and additional cards would be given out as Highly Commended. These would be white with no date, no signature and no sponsor to avoid the cards being out of date and presented for the Northern and Southern Regional Finals for the Public Speaking and Performing Arts.

6.1.2. Just a Minute Under 21 – nothing to note

6.1.3. Debating Under 26 – nothing to note

6.1.5. Just a Minute Under 21

- 6.1.5.1. Correspondence received from Shropshire from the judging at West Midlands Area regarding clarification of terminology was responded to by DH prior to the meeting due to the timing of the National Final. The clarification has been added to the just a minute rules 2013-14 which are available on the NFYFC website.

6.1.6. Debating Under 26

- 6.1.6.1. Buckinghamshire withdrew at the last minute so were fined £40. A scratch team had to be put together from various stewards and competitors who were at the finals on the day. Hannah Talbot (HT) asked the CSG if £40 was enough of a deterrent as the same area had withdrawn at the last minute 2 years running. DH proposed a £100 which sparked comments of this prevents teams entering, counties are still billed and the team should still send the team they can. The CSG agreed to propose to council an increase in fines of £50 from £25 for withdrawing 2 weeks prior to the event and £100 from £40 48 hours prior to the event. This would be imposed from 1st September 2014 and limited to competitions including Senior Public Speaking, Performing arts, Sports and Tug of war, farm skills, cube, floral art and cookery where a cost was incurred for venues or equipment.

6.2. Entertainments Regional Finals

6.3. Annual Convention

The CSG viewed the slides and comments received from the online AGM feedback. Slides to be emailed to CSG members

6.3.1. Entertainments

- 6.3.1.1. Correspondence from Shropshire regarding using NODA instead of GODA judges. The CSG discussed at length and all were in favour of using NODA for Pantomime in 2014-15 and GODA for Drama in 2015-16. NODA will be asked to give written feedback and a positive critique for each team with NFYFC providing a template for both regional and national finals. JS proposed adding a YFC judge onto the panel and FC seconded. Also to ensure that Stewards had their badges on to identify them.
- 6.3.1.2. NFYFC to note for the planning next year for a 5 minute bell to sound for the audience to take their seats, chief steward to remain by the doors to manage the security staff, the compere to have a head mike and in the programme the Muller Wiseman introduction should be placed below the competitions chairman's welcome.
- 6.3.1.3. The risk assessment was taken out of the marking scheme from the rules circulated. However, each team were asked to provide a risk assessment for their performance.
- 6.3.1.4. Judges commented on how much they had enjoyed the competition.

6.3.2. Senior Member of the Year

- 6.3.2.1. Correspondence received expressing that the questions were too lengthy on stage and should possibly include one serious and one light hearted one. The overall competition was too long however the timetable for the competitors is sent in the competitors notes and if they wished once the interviews had been completed they were free to leave.
- 6.3.2.2. Add into the judges' notes for the compere as to state which question is for which competitor.
- 6.3.2.3. The stage question should already have been asked in the interview plus an additional CV based question. This to be added to the Rules for 2014-15.

6.3.3. Choir

- 6.3.3.1. Noise Levels meant it was difficult to hear the choirs and could have been better in the theatre on the stage or to have more AV equipment (shell). If this competition was held in future then a bar should not be in the room.

6.3.4. Disco

- 6.3.4.1. Good to introduce the teams before the competition commences.
- 6.3.4.2. Regarding the dress of some of the competitions it was noted that suitable under clothing should be worn!

6.3.5. Darts

- 6.3.5.1. Sponsorship from the CHE Bar of £600.
- 6.3.5.2. More competitors needed which could be achieved if the competitions commenced at 11am as suggested.
- 6.3.5.3. Possible to run a league competition and also a separate 6 dart challenge pay as you play to give more

opportunity for the crowd to have a go.

6.3.5.4. Bar needs to be open

6.3.5.5. If the competition is only open for wrist banded members then registration area needs to be open so that wristbands can be collected.

6.3.5.6. Thumbs up from SWA as they enjoyed taking part.

6.3.5.7. NA did a great job spreading the word. Laurie was a fantastic compere and should be asked again in future.

6.3.6. Raffle

6.3.6.1. Excellent prizes on offer thanks to CE

6.3.6.2. It was a struggle to sell tickets during performances and for 2015 raffle tickets will be sold at registration, throughout the competitions and the winners announced at the dancing competition on the Sunday afternoon.

7.1. Staff Conference – UK Dodgeball - Counties have received information to contact UK Dodgeball to help with organising the 2014 competition.

7.3. English Cricket Board (ECB) – Joe Steel – have approved Kwik Cricket Rules for 2014/15 and are aiming to distribute an information pack to all Counties.

7.4. Child Licences – Wednesday, 4th June, 2014

7.4.1. Margaret Bennett (MB) thanked everyone that helped with the licences for 2013-14 performing arts competition especially Cath Sykes.

7.4.2. For 2014-15 Child licences will be required for members under 16 taking part in the pantomime as they perform to a paying audience more than 4 times. NFYFC are currently in talks with Senior Child Licence Officer at the Department for Education and YFC will input into the upcoming policy consultation.

7.4.3. Wales will have to apply separately to the Wales Assembly

7.4.4. Chaperone licences are currently being worked on and NFYFC will issue guidelines to counties.

7.4.5. Clare Worden (CW) thanked Cath Sykes (CS), MB and DH for all of their work

7.5. UK Athletics

7.5.1. GH currently in discussion with UK Athletics regarding age discrepancies. Freddie Wootton (FW) commented that younger members would prefer to run separately. Currently proposed as a direct entry with individuals and teams of 4 taking part. The CSG agreed to outsource timing runners.

8. Nominations for Judges and Stewards

8.1. **Competitions Day - Saturday, 5th July, 2014 - County Showground, Stafford**

8.1.1. Judges and stewards for competitions day have been confirmed.

8.1.2. Situations Vacant Competition – The CSG reviewed comments received and that the competition is really useful and will be revamped for 2015

8.1.3. Cube Exhibit (to be held at Tenbury Show) – comments cards required – Wales have voiced concern that it should be held with Competitions Day but Tenbury Show will be trialled this year.

8.1.4. Oven Gloves and Apron (pre-judged) – To be held on Competitions Day with the top three placed items will be displayed at Tenbury Show and also at the CLA Game Fair

8.1.5. Rural Road Safety – Right Driver have supported YFC by writing a specific online programme for the hazard perception task and competitors will be asked to identify faults on a car and also to change a wheel.

- 8.2. Journey of Tweed – 18 and Over – To be held on Competitions Day with the top three placed items will be displayed at Tenbury Show and also at the CLA Game Fair
- 8.3. **Sports Day – Sunday, 6th July, 2014 – Staffordshire – Rugeley Leisure Centre & Hagley Park Academy**
- 8.3.1. Judges and stewards for sports day have been confirmed.
- 8.3.2. Mixed Badminton – 10 to 14 yrs (Doubles) – Wales not taking part
- 8.3.3. Tag Rugby 14 to 17 yrs (Mixed) – Touch Rugby – O2 Touch are providing kit and banners
- 8.3.4. Rush Hockey – 16 & Over (Mixed – Rush Hockey) – Wales not taking part
- 8.3.5. Tuck Shop by Staffordshire FYFC
- 8.3.6. The CSG noted that in general counties are not holding rounds and there are few teams taking part at Area level and as a consequence there is not enough representation coming through to the national final.
- 8.4. **Dairy Stockjudging – Yorkshire Agricultural Society – Thursday, 10th July, 2014 – Great Yorkshire Show**
- 8.4.1. Judges and stewards for the Great Yorkshire Show have been confirmed
- 8.4.2. All members of the CSG were in favour of the linear assessment card change for 2015. This include a change in stature for Very Tall from 149 to 154 cms and Very Small from 125 to 130cms and Level with Hock 2. New cards to be printed to sell in the Club Shop.
- 8.5. **Tug of War Finals – Saturday, 2nd August, 2014 – Tenbury Agricultural Show**
- 8.5.1. Sarah Bellew (SB) on behalf of SWA not happy about the clash with the UK championships and asked if medals could be presented instead of prize cards. DH said prize cards would be presented in line with all other NFYFC national finals as medals had been looked into in the past and worked out more expensive.
- 8.5.2. NA were concerned that the same judges were being used as last year’s final. It was noted that the UK Championships were being held this year on the same weekend and we had to use judges that were staying in England. High Standard Grade 1 judges are required so in order for YFC to have their own judges, YFC and the TOWA need to work together and provide training for interested members.
- 8.5.3. GENSB Tug of War – Teams qualifying for the NFYFC National finals could also take part in the International GENSB Tournament held in August at Folkestone.
- 8.5.4. Tenbury Show have requested a YFC presence in the main ring. CSG discussed a display pull for approx 20 minutes against a local team as NFYFC final will remain in the YFC ring. MB to check insurance. DH to confirm timings of the day.
- 8.6. **Farm Skills weekend – Saturday, 6th and Sunday, 7th September, 2014 – Harper Adams University (confirmed)**
- 8.6.1. MB noted nominations for judges and stewards.

However, YFC current rules state that substitution are not allowed. Current rules state the best of 3 pulls but DH proposed pulling 2 ends only with a round robin league and scoring done on scores rather than wins. The semi final and final would remain the best of 3 pulls for 2014. DH requested all to feedback from Areas by the end of July for decision for the 2014/2015 rules of the competition.
 - 9.3.5. Fence Erecting – discussion regarding Herefordshire’s comments on the tree guard being too easy. Eastern Area like the idea. DH to amend the rules to include the angles of the posts. Fence erecting to be taken to Competitions Day was discussed. The final would then be held within the competitions year and members would not have to rejoin on 1st September. All feedback from Areas by the end of July.
